


Dumfries & Galloway Council

McJarrow Park & King Edward Park, Lockerbie

Engagement on Parks Upgrade (funding from the Lockerbie Trust)



The Lockerbie Trust has made £500k available for Dumfries & Galloway Council to deliver the Lockerbie Parks Project. Following on from the previous engagement, Dumfries & Galloway Council are keen to seek the views of citizens and community groups on the updated proposal for McJarrow Park and King Edward Park, Lockerbie. The feedback provided previously has been considered and the proposed project has been further updated on that basis.

Your feedback will be included in a publicly available Report to Elected Members in February 2024 for their consideration and decision.

It may be that the £500k available will not cover the costs of all elements being proposed. However, we are further keen to work with local Community Groups in seeking match funding for elements that cannot be funded with this money, please complete your details at the end of this questionnaire so you can be considered.

We are seeking your feedback on 6 main elements and 3 additional supporting elements for the project.

PUMP TRACK - (King Edward Park)

Pump Tracks are designed to host almost anything on wheels, from bikes and skateboards to wheelchairs, which also makes them inclusive. There are three options for a new Pump Track (Standard, Medium and International). The costs reflect the size.

Standard Pump Track	130m (track length) 1125m ² (overall site)
Medium Pump Track	170m (track length) 1200 -1500m ² (overall site)
International Pump Track	300m (track length) 2500m ² (overall site)

Option 1 – Standard Pump Track (similar to Annan).



Option 2 – Medium Pump Track which the supplier indicates would be large enough to hold competitions.



Option 3 – International Pump Track

This is by far the largest pump track and would occupy 2500m². The suppliers of Pump Tracks have indicated that a medium pump track is suitable to host competitions.





The general opinion from the last engagement was for a modern design event space. There could be several solutions to the concerns expressed about the bandstand becoming a focus for anti-social behaviour and vandalism.

CHANGING PLACES TOILET/GENERAL USE TOILETS – McJerrrow Park

There was strong feeling among survey respondents that additional toilet facilities should be installed alongside the Changing Places Pod. Respondents felt that there was a need for additional toilets in the park as the nearest facilities are across a busy road some distance from the park, or not always open. The location of the changing places pod and additional toilet/s will be easily accessible from the disabled parking bays and for other car park/park users and be easily accessible from the High Street for pedestrians. DGC will take on the maintenance and cleaning.

PATHS, LIGHTING AND CCTV

You told us previously that these three areas were important to you. We have included these in this questionnaire to provide you with indicative costs and to get your feedback and views on each.

Paths - The paths in McJerrow Park are generally in good order. However, there was a general feeling during the previous engagement that many residents felt the quality of some footpaths in McJerrow Park may restrict the accessibility of the park to certain users eg wheelchairs, prams etc.

Lighting - There was a very strong feeling that improved lighting would be needed in McJerrow Park to help protect the new facilities against anti-social behaviour and increase a feeling of safety for park users. Improved lighting would also help extend the time that equipment could be used (gym equipment etc).

CCTV - There was a very strong feeling that CCTV would be required in McJerrow Park to help protect the new facilities and prevent inappropriate use of equipment and vandalism and improve a sense of safety for park users. Consideration is needed on who can use/view the CCTV and where any cameras should be placed.
